Message from the Board Chair

Dear Kind Supporters and Stakeholders,

During 2024, the Odeefoo Oteng Korankye II
Education Fund had three areas of focus: awarding secondary school scholarships, organizing teacher training workshops, and growing our endowment fund. The number of students who benefited from our scholarship program in 2024 included 16 top BECE performers among 12 schools in South Akwapim, 2 students pursuing TVET training at Design Technology Institute, and one special needs student pursuing visual arts at Mampong Akwapim Senior High Technical School for the Deaf.

I am proud of the fact that, since the beginning of the scholarship program in 2017, 132 pupils (117 high school and 15 TVET scholarships) from South Akwapim have been positively impacted through our scholarship program.

In the area of teacher training, the fund organized 2 workshops for 64 local JSS teachers to help them better prepare their pupils for BECE exams in Integrated Science, Social Studies and RME. The fund also sponsored 12 teachers from the Berekuso Basic School to attend The Educator's Network (TEN) conference held at Lincoln Community School in Accra.

Professional development opportunities such as these help local teachers expand their pedagogical content knowledge, learn about current trends in classroom teaching, and improve learning outcomes for their pupils.

The focus of our fundraising efforts this year was to increase the Odeefoo Oteng Korankye II Scholarship Endowment Fund. To that end, we raised a total of 434,042.00 GHS, including a generous 50,000.00 GHS donation from Development Bank Ghana. As a result, the endowment fund grew from 224,873.78 GHS in December of 2023 to 351,136.31 GHS in December of 2024. The remaining funds raised went toward teacher training, support to schools, and administrative and fundraising expenses. The purpose of the endowment fund is to use the interest on 182-day treasury bills to pay scholarship expenses while leaving the principal intact. This approach secures the scholarship program into the future. Eventually, the Odeefoo Oteng Korankye II Education Fund aims to increase the size of the endowment to so that interest earned covers all scholarship expenses each year.

Although Akwapim South boasts some very bright pupils who performed well on the BECE exam and proceeded to excellent secondary schools, one thing we learned from the WAEC data is that the average performance of children from our 12 schools is poor. Among 515 pupils who took the BECE exam from the 12 schools under the fund, the average score in 2024 was 40. This is a symptom of weak foundations in literacy and numeracy among our pupils.

Therefore, for the next two years, the Odeefoo Oteng Korankye II Education Fund Governing Board has decided to focus our teacher training programs on early childhood education. We have collaborated with the Early Childhood Unit of the Ghana Education Service to plan a workshop in the learning through play method for KG teachers in May this year and will follow with additional workshops for class 1 and 2 teachers later in the year and in 2026.

The Odeefoo Oteng Korankye II Education Fund is a not-for-profit organisation duly registered with the Registrar General's Department with the license to operate as a Company Limited by Guarantee. Established on November 3, 2016, by Nana Oteng Korankye II, the Chief of Berekuso and the Twafohene of Akuapem, the Fund took its inspiration from the need to impact the development of Berekuso and surrounding areas through the provision of quality education. The Fund raises money and provides support to students, teachers, and schools in these areas. Since its establishment, the Fund has seen improvement and progress in the lives of its beneficiaries and their families. Our core values are commitment & hard work, impartiality, accountability & transparency, and innovation & action.

Vision

To make Berekuso a center of excellence for education and purposeful development.

Objectives

We aim to impact development by providing secondary school scholarships to promising pupils and by supporting teachers and schools to improve the quality of education they offer.

Areas of Impact

As part of its mission to impact development through education, the Fund offers the following opportunities to students, teachers, and the community as a whole.

- Scholarships: Currently, the Fund provides secondary school scholarships to top BECE candidates from 14 basic schools in the traditional area.
- **Teacher Training:** The Fund provides avenues and support for improving the skills and competencies of teachers in the 14 basic schools where beneficiaries are chosen.
- Support to Schools: This takes the form of refurbishment projects, field trips, and the provision of examination supplies to help candidates during the Basic Education Certificate Examinations (BECE), etc

Scholarship Program Update

In 2024, 16 new secondary scholarships were awarded to Form 3 pupils who performed well on the BECE exam. This brought the number of students under the scholarship program to 47. Since its inception, the Fund has provided secondary school scholarships to a total of 117 pupils from 14 basic schools in Berekuso and surrounding communities.

Below are some key highlights of the scholarships awarded during 2024:

- 1. The best BECE aggregate score was 9.
- 2. The top performing students came from 6 basic schools.
- 3. The average aggregate score of all 515 BECE candidates was 40. Compared with past years, this was a poor performance. Therefore, the Board will work with the various schools to improve pupils' academic achievement in the coming year.
- 4. Six out of the 16 of the new Form 1 scholarships went to female students.

Vocational and Technical Training:

Aside from the 47 secondary school scholarships, the Fund provided financial and other support to 2 new students to further their education learning welding and fabrication at the Design and Technology Institute. To date, the Fund has supported a total of 15 youth to receive TVET training at Design and Technology Institute.

Other Forms of Supports:

- 1. Training workshops covered grading, classroom management, and formative assessment for 64 teachers in three subjects, including Science.
- 2. 12 teachers from the Berekuso Basic School were sponsered to attend The Educator's Network (TEN) conference, held at Lincoln Community School in Accra.
- 3. Essay writing competitions for Form 1, Form 2, and Form 3 pupils, with a total of 126 pupils participating.
- 4. Provision of math kits and other items to BECE candidates.
- 5. Support to Twafoman SecTech: GHS50,000.
- 6. Scholarship to a special needs student pursuing Visual Arts at Mampong School for the Deaf.
- 7. Sensitization program for 526 BECE candidates by retired WAEC officials.

Financial Overview

Since the Fund's establishment in November 2016 to December 2024, a total of GHS 1,376,171.67 (almost GHS 1.4 million) has been spent on scholarship disbursements, support to schools and BECE candidates, vacation classes for scholarship beneficiaries, training programs for teachers, and other activities of the Fund.

The Fund's Board of Trustees ensures that financial statements are prepared and presented fairly according to the International Financial Reporting Standards for SMEs and in the manner required by the Companies Act of Ghana, 2019, (Act 992). The report below gives statements of financial position and financial activity for the years 2024 and 2023.
